Best Practices for New Fellow Nominations: Preparing and Submitting the ACCL New Fellow Nomination Form

The ACCL Board of Governors (BOG) has produced a "best practices" New Fellow Nomination Form, which is contained in the ACCL Practice and Procedures Manual. The BOG offers the "model form" and this introduction as a recommended procedure for submitting ACCL New Fellow Nominations to the Nominating Committee.

Currently, ACCL New Fellow nomination packages submitted to the Membership Committee vary significantly in detail and content. Experience instructs us to offer detail rather than general statements about a nominee, even when the person is well known to members of the Membership Committee. To that end, the BOG offers the following best practices in submitting an ACCL New Fellow nomination. Attached to this Introduction is a "model" nomination form that incorporates these recommended practices.

- 1. The ACCL Nomination Form is a key part of the nomination process. The nominating Fellow should not skimp on supplying accurate, timely, and complete information for the use of the Nominating Committee. Every nomination is evaluated as it compares to other nominees, and thus an abbreviated form may not be viewed favorably. If the nominee's CV has not been updated in years, and the form does not reflect updated data, it may be viewed negatively by the Nominating Committee.
- 2. List graduate degrees/certifications that relate to the practice of construction law.
- 3. List all employments post law school graduation. Gaps in employment history should be explained.
- 4. List all state and federal court bar and board admissions and years of admission.
- 5. List all publications, most recent to oldest. Gaps in years of publications will be apparent.
- 6. The College considers public presentations, publications, and the teaching of construction law to constitute "give back" to the industry. It is an important consideration in determining admission into the College. List hosting organizations, titles of presentations and written materials produced.
- 7. List the name, years of membership, and if applicable, leadership positions in appropriate bar association & construction industry committees, forums, etc., including years of membership and service.
- 8. List with particularity a representative sampling of the "major cases" in which the nominee has participated in a "first chair" position. Each entry should contain the name of the case, file number/designation, a short description of the matter, listing of the arbitrators by name and opposing counsel by name, firm association, and contact

information, including address, e-mail address and phone number. It is important to identify opposing counsel and counsel for related parties. These lawyers are likely to be contacted, so current contact information is essential. Make it easy for the Nominating Committee to make the contacts.

9. List the "Seconding Fellows" by name and include contact information for each. Attach their seconding letters to the nomination form. Do not exceed the number of "seconds" permitted by ACCL By-Laws.
